

C. Raja Mohan is a Visiting Professor at the Institute of South Asian Studies of the National University of Singapore, and formerly its Director. He is a Non-Resident Distinguished Fellow with the Asia Society Policy Institute in Delhi, India. He was previously Professor of South Asian Studies at Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi, and at the S Rajaratnam School of International Studies, Nanyang Technological University, Singapore.

Raja Mohan was the founding director of Carnegie India in Delhi, the sixth international center of Carnegie Endowment for Peace Founding Director of the India Center of the Carnegie Endowment for International Peace. He served on India's National Security Advisory Board and has published widely on India's foreign and security policies. He was the Henry A. Kissinger Chair in Foreign Policy and International Relations at the Kluge Center, US Library of Congress, Washington DC, during 2009-10. He convened the India chapter of Pugwash Conferences on Science and World Affairs, during 1995-2005.

Raja is also a columnist for Foreign Policy and the Indian Express

He has published widely on India's foreign and security policies, Asian geopolitics, and the global governance of advanced technologies.

Prof Mohan's research interests include Asian geopolitics, Indian foreign and security policies, and the global governance of new technologies. His areas of expertise include:


